### ECCLESIASTES 6:6 (ESV and LB)

*Even though a man should live a thousand years twice over, yet enjoy no good...do not all go to the one place?*

**Living Bible:** *Though a man lives a thousand years twice over, but doesn't find contentment... what's the use?*

### I. SOLOMON'S SEARCH FOR HAPPINESS, Ecclesiastes 1 & 2

1. Education can't make you lastingly happy (Ecc. 1:16-18).
2. Pleasure can't make you lastingly happy (Ecc. 2:1-3, 10).

\*Pleasure seeking took three forms:

a) Laughing

**INSIGHT:** A lot of laughter today is empty. People laugh but they aren't happy.

b) Wine

c) Good times

**INSIGHT:** Solomon learned that an affair or multiple sex partners only increases the emptiness in your soul.

**TRUTH:** The most bored people are people who live for pleasure.

3. Achievement (Ecc. 2:4-5, 20)

**TRUTH:** Life satisfaction can't be found in workaholism.

4. Wealth (Ecc. 2:7-8)

**INSIGHT:** You're living a Solomon life if what you make is never enough and you keep thinking about making more.

5. Success (Ecc. 2:9, 11)

**INSIGHT:** God says there are definite dead ends in a search for life happiness you can avoid, because they don't satisfy.

\*The Lord Jesus gives us 8 pieces to a happy life in The Beatitudes in Matthew 5:3-10.

## II. JESUS' KEYS TO TRUE HAPPINESS IN LIFE

1. Knowing God (Matthew 5:3)

**TRUTH:** If anything but God is at the center of your life, you will not be satisfied.

2. Trust God in disappointment (Matthew 5:4).

**TRUTH:** You have to learn to be happy in the problem, in the situation.

3. Expect God to meet your needs (Matthew 5:5).

**CHALLENGE:** Stop trying to grab all you can get, and relax and trust God to take care of your needs.

**TRUTH:** Self-centered people are never happy.

4. Follow God's instructions (Matthew 5:6).

5. Cultivate a forgiving heart (Matthew 5:7).

**TRUTH:** The reason someone hurt us is irrelevant in God's eyes. The question is, "What will you do?"

**AXIOM:** I can't be happy as long as I hold to a hurt.

6. Keep a clear conscience (Matthew 5:8).

7. Build healthy relationships (Matthew 5:9).

8. Live with eternity in mind (Matthew 5:10).
